A Message from Monsignor Carr

Dear Parishioners,

It is time for us to consider how we will prepare for and celebrate Lent as individuals and as a parish. We are all used to hearing messages about giving up something during Lent. Rather than suggest that approach, I ask you to make Lent a time to renew your own devotion to the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. I am suggesting you begin by examining your preparations for Mass. This will be a most pleasing sacrifice for the Lord and challenging sacrifice for some. To sacrifice time and routine for Him in view of His all-loving sacrifice for us will be most pleasing to God and a good change for some to make.

Our preparation for Mass is crucial to our spiritual lives and we receive so much more from Mass when we **prepare during the week, arrange our schedules to arrive 15 minutes before Mass and heartily participate**. There are some other practical steps to prepare for the celebration of Mass in the St. Bridget Parish *Handbook for the Assembly*. I hope you got your own copy of this in the Fall. If you did not, additional copies are available in the commons.

In addition to these individual suggestions, the parish will be changing the custom of announcements prior to Mass so that this time might be devoted to preparing to meet the Risen Christ in the celebration of the Eucharist. As you know, for some years now we have made announcements before Mass begins. On the First Sunday of Lent, February 26 Mass will begin promptly at the appointed hour without announcements preceding it. Announcements will not be made before Mass from then on. From time to time Father Brian and I will make an announcement that pertains to the spiritual life or fellowship of the parish.

I believe that if we commit both as individuals and as a parish to preparing well to meet the Lord who comes to us, really present, during the Mass, we will have a joyous Lent and an Easter where we will be able to join with all the choirs of angels and saints singing "Alleluia! He is Risen!"

Father Brian and our pastoral staff send you the assurance of our prayers for a holy and happy Lent.

Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2012 and **Good Friday, April 6, 2012**, are days of fast and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence. **Fasting** is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.
